#### What is PAEYS?

PAEYS stands for Performance and Education Yield Success and is a project that provides education-based salary supplements to the family support workforce employed by a MIECHV or HOPES HFI-funded site in Iowa. The project is designed to increase employee retention, education, performance and compensation.



## **ELIGIBILITY**

An individual must work at least 10 hours per week funded by MIECHV or HOPES HFI (.25 FTE) and maintain a caseload of at least three families. Any family support professional meeting these criteria (or supervising a family support professional meeting these criteria) in a MIECHV or HOPES HFI-funded site in lowa may be eligible. The recipient must also have a level of education that appears on the PAEYS supplement scale. In order to qualify, individuals must:

- Work at a MIEHCV or HOPES HFI site in Iowa, for a minimum of 90 days
- · Work a minimum of 10 hours per week
- Have one of the education levels listed on the scale (from regionally accredited schools)
- Remain employed and be meeting established performance benchmarks on a quarterly basis
  - 85% of required data points for the quarter must be complete and submitted on time to meet the threshold for payment
  - For supervisors, data will be assessed at the program level, not individual data

# **COMPENSATION & EDUCATION**

Salary supplement amounts are tied to the participant's level of education. Checks are issued every three months (quarterly). The amount received will reflect time worked during the three-month period and successful completion of individual performance benchmarks. Eligible individuals will receive between \$1,600 and \$4,700 annually.

## **PAEYS INFORMATION**

#### Level 1 and Level 2 Participants:

Participants on Level 1 or Level 2 who are actively working towards a college degree can earn additional dollars. This can be done by submitting proof of current coursework each quarter. With proof of coursework a participant can be a Level 1\* or a Level 2\* on the PAEYS supplement scale.

 It is the responsibility of the participant to notify PAEYS about current education

#### **EARNING A HIGHER SUPPLEMENT**

PAEYS participants at lower levels can increase their supplement amounts by gaining more education. Iowa AEYC and the T.E.A.C.H. Early Childhood® IOWA program offer scholarships to family support professionals who want to earn college credits toward related credentials or degrees. Contact T.E.A.C.H. Participants are encouraged to send PAEYS an updated transcript after completion of any formal coursework so staff can determine the highest possible award. Level 3 participants can move to a Level 4 by obtaining a MA degree with the help of T.E.A.C.H. Early Childhood® lowa.

# INFORMATION FOR ELIGIBLE SUPERVISORS

In order for supervisors to receive quarterly supplement they must:

- Meet established performance benchmarks on a quarterly basis at the agency level
- Meet established performance benchmarks on a quarterly basis for personal data (if applicable)
- Complete one approved module on the Institute for the Advancement of Family Support Professionals each quarter



# **FAQS**

What do I have to do to get started on PAEYS?

Complete an application and provide proof of college education earned.

How are supplements received?

Checks are typically sent to eligible participants on a quarterly basis, following verification of employment and successful completion of benchmarks, as confirmed by the lowa Department of Public Health.

Do I have to pay taxes on the supplement I receive?

Yes, because the salary supplement is income. Participants will receive an IRS-1099 form at the end of the year if they received \$600 or more from lowa AEYC during the calendar year. Recipients are responsible for reporting and paying personal income taxes due.
